The second part of this report presents an empirical test of the proposed R-MPI, using data from four household surveys conducted in Ethiopia, Malawi, the Niger, and Nigeria which are harmonized within the Rural Livelihoods Information System (RuLIS).

Human Information Interaction Feb 12 2021 A fresh research approach that bridges the study of human information interaction and the design of information systems. Human information interaction (HII) is an

emerging area of study that investigates how people interact with information; its subfield human information behavior (HIB) is a flourishing, active discipline.
